Ice is a phenomenon of great significance. Not only as an obstacle that must be tackled with icebreakers for maritime traffic to pass through, but also as an integral component of the infrastructure when sea inlets turn into surfaces drivable by different vehicles like cars and trucks. A number of factors now affect the conditions of this medium. Climate change is one factor. Added to this are new constructions in the waters that influence shipping routes, which in turn have an impact on the ice.
